Northwest Junior High School—Linda Lujan & Students

ELP Students from Northwest Middle School proposed to the community council that the students of Northwest be allowed to vote on the mascot. When the new school was built, a new mascot was chosen, but without student say. The students presented the idea of letting the students vote on 1) keeping the new mascot, the Thunderbirds.
