Salt Lake City Police -- Det. Joseph Sturzenegger

Food Vendors: City is concerned over food safety. City's plan is to educate vendors on how to get permits and business licenses. A license is required to sell food. Carts cannot be licensed because they are mobile. Classes will be available to teach vendors how to become licensed. Police will be enforcing "no neighborhood food vending". Food will be seized and destroyed. Citizens should refrain from purchasing food from these vendors.

The Jordan River Parkway now has a posted curfew. No one is to be on the parkway between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. without special city permission. This posting will allow police to arrest those found trespassing during the curfew hours, curtailing illegal activity happening there.

Citizens have the right to ask congregating kids what they are up to, especially if it is late. If it too late to be out, report to the police.
