Item 3 Crime Report

Each month the Salt Lake City Police Department prepares a report of criminal activity for each Community Council area. Statistics show that crime is lowered in part, due to good citizens keeping a watchful eye on our homes and streets and reporting concerns to our SLC Police officers in a timely way. The website that records all criminal activity for the city can be accessed by going to www.slcpd.com.

The total offenses for our community for the month of January decreased from 50 to 41. Specifically: auto thefts went from 9 to 15, gang related from 2 to 0, burglary incidents from 10 to 5, car prowls from 4 to 6 and damaged property reports went from 18 to 8, this number includes damage to businesses, homes, cars and graffiti damage. We have shared only 5 of the 11 areas that are reported monthly.

Information is available on how you can be more involved in our community crime prevention through our Neighborhood Watch and Mobil Watch programs. These programs are working for us. Anita Austin is the Board President of the Terraces of Rose Park condo complex and our hats are off to her and others in the community for taking on some drug trafficking and car theft and prowl concerns around the condo complex.
