Airport Light Rail Becomes Reality

By 2015, District One residents will ride between the Salt Lake International Airport and downtown on a light rail train that will run down North Temple and along 400 West. On May 6, 2008, the Salt Lake City Council unanimously approved an interlocal agreement between the City and the Utah Transit Authority (UTA). The vote also authorized Mayor Ralph Becker to sign the agreement. The contract is the last link in a series of local and federal agreements UTA needed to start construction of four light rail lines and a southern extension of the Front Runner commuter rail to an area that includes 2200 West, 2200 North and North Temple. If a rail station is not built within four years of the airport line starting service, UTA and the City will split the cost of building the station.
