

Fairpark Community Council Meeting Minutes
March 26, 2009

Executive Committee in attendance: Victoria Orme, Brad Hart & Tiffany Sandberg

1-Brad welcomed everyone.

2-Jon R moved to approve the minutes from our previous meeting, Gordon S seconded, the motion passed.

3-Yolanda Francisco-Nez (SLC Mayor's office) was filling in for Michael Stott.

She presented us with flyers about the upcoming budget workshops and Mayor Becker's stimulus money priorities.

4-Rachel White explained the need for rebuilding Guadalupe Park. The play structure is outdated and does not meet ADA requirements. She asked for letters of support to be sent to Rick Graham stating that we would like to see this park get overhauled and new playground equipment get installed. Vicky O made a motion that we send a letter from the community council, Mike B seconded, the motion carried.

5-Gracie Mora (Day-Riverside Library) told us about upcoming workshops with Tree Utah and Wasatch Community Gardens in the Eco-Garden.

6-Joe Sturzenegger (SLCPD) gave us an update on our ongoing issues. There is still work being done on writing an ordinance to assist the police in stopping the illegal cart vendors. The "No Trespassing" signs should be going up on the Jordan River Parkway soon. With the warmer weather, illegal yard sales are on the rise. An illegal yard sale is one that takes place on public property. Please report these to Joe with the address. There have been reports of problems at Constitution Park with drug dealers, graffiti and transients. Joe has referred this issue to the Fusion Bike Patrol.

Martha Stonebrook is in the process of drafting a street racing ordinance that will make street racing a specific offense, not just a speeding ticket. If you know of specific locations where this is an issue, let Joe know.

7-Our Station 7 firefighters and EMTs were present. Station 7 is an Advanced Life Support station. They average a 3 minute response time to most calls. The crew consists of a Captain, Engineer and at least 2 fire fighters who are also trained EMT's or paramedics.

8-Vicky O brought a draft of the Euclid Master Plan for people to see.

9-Debbi Lyons (SLC Recycling Program Manager) came to get input regarding a market development program. The program assists businesses that collect, process distribute or use recycled materials in their operation. In order to qualify, a business must be operating since at least December of 2008 and be located

- In an M-1 (Light Manufacturing) or M-2 (Heavy Manufacturing) Zoning District, as these zoning classifications allow recycling activities; and
- Either west of Interstate 215 or north of 600 North, which creates a buffer between any residential or commercial zones and the highest concentration of manufacturing or recycling businesses.

Wendy R motioned that we write a letter of support for this program, Gordon S seconded, the motion carried.

10-Jennifer Seelig (State Representative, District 23) asked for input as to what we would like her to have ready to report to us on concerning this year's session. She was pleased to announce that the legislature approved \$20 million dollars to be spent on rebuilding the North Temple viaduct.

11-Tiffany S asked for a motion to waive the attendance requirement for people who want to serve the next term on the community council's executive board. Jon R moved to waive the requirement, Wendy R seconded, the motion carried. She introduced 4 community members who would like to serve.
