### **Council to Hold Public Hearing on Proposed Public Safety Facilities Bond**

**SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH** – The Salt Lake City Council will hold a public hearing on Mayor Ralph Becker’s revised proposal for a Public Safety Complex at a cost not to exceed \$125 million. The project would be funded with a general obligation bond to be decided by Salt Lake City voters in November. The hearing will be Tuesday, July 7 at 7 p.m. in the City Council Chamber.

After soliciting public input on various location options through a variety of open houses and other public forums, Mayor Becker has formally recommended to the Council that the project be built on the east side of 300 East Street between 400 and 500 South Streets, just east of the Library Block. Mayor Becker’s recommendation on the location is based on a report written by David H. Hart, FAIA, Architect of the State Capitol, who reviewed all of the public input and data on 10 different location options. The Council is soliciting public input on the overall project and bond proposal, as well as the Mayor’s recommended project location.
