Citizen Involvement in Crime Prevention

Report crimes or suspicious behavior every time!

- Every time a crime is reported it is logged and tracked, allowing police to monitor *hot spots* and create strategies for addressing problem areas.
- In emergencies, dial 911. Otherwise, call police dispatch at 799-3000.

Keep informed about crime trends in your area so you can keep an eye out

- By visiting the Police Department's website, you can track recent crimes in your area, all mapped out on your computer screen.
- Go to www.slcgov.com/police and click on *SLCPD Online*.

Rewards are available through the TIPS4CA\$H program

- Even if a reward is not announced, a reward is available for information leading to the conviction of a criminal in serious crimes.
- Callers may remain anonymous and still be eligible for a reward.
- To place a tip, call 799-INFO (4636).

Community Action Teams (CAT) pool resources to solve recurring problems

- CAT teams consist of representative of various government and community agencies, all of whom bring their expertise and resources to help solve vexing, ongoing neighborhood problems, including criminal activity.
- Contact your Community Mobilization Specialist to get your CAT team working to solve your problem.

Neighborhood Watch Program

- Through the Neighborhood Watch program, neighbors can band together to help prevent crime. Program participants attend regular community meetings and undergo special training. Once a neighborhood has sufficient participation and training, signs can be posted to warn criminals that the neighborhood is under constant surveillance.

Mobile Neighborhood Watch

- Even if your area does not have an organized Neighborhood Watch program in place, you can help prevent crime by participating in the Mobile Neighborhood Watch program.
- Participants receive special training and communications links with the Police. Mobile Watch volunteers report suspicious activities and crime to help police respond more quickly and prevent dangerous situations.
