**Mayor Becker Asks Elementary Students to Represent Him at World
Premier of “High School Musical 3” in Salt Lake City Tonight**

*Sorensen Multi-Cultural Center After-School Students to be Mayor’s
Ambassadors*

SALT LAKE CITY – A surprise announcement was made today by Mayor Becker’s Office to a group of 10 students from the Sorensen Multi-Cultural Center’s after-school Open Recreation Program – they will be representing Mayor Becker as City Ambassadors to the world premier of “High School Musical 3” tonight.

The student ambassadors, ages 6-12 are part of the Sorensen Multi-Cultural Center’s after-school Open Recreation Program. The students attend Salt Lake City School District elementary schools; Riley, Dual Immersion Academy, Mountain View, and Parkview.

Mayor Becker was asked by Zion’s Bank CEO Scott Anderson if he knew of anyone who would like to attend the film event. The Mayor, who is out-of-town tonight and cannot attend the premier, determined there were indeed some students who would appreciate the film and represent the City well on his behalf.
