

# SALT LAKE CITY MAYORS SPEAK

On Thursday, February 12, at 7:00 p.m., The City Library will host former and current Salt Lake City mayors to share their vision of the city's past, present, and future. Mayors Jake Garn, Ted Wilson, Palmer DePaulis, Deedee Corradini, Rocky Anderson, and Ralph Becker have been invited to share their successes, challenges, advice, and view of Salt Lake City's future. Ken Verdoia from KUED will moderate the panel discussion.

From Garn to Becker, the panel of mayors represents nearly four decades of leadership in Salt Lake City. No matter how one gauges it, Utah's capitol city has changed greatly since Garn entered the mayor's office in 1972: the skyline has risen, the population has become more diverse, a downtown arts district was established, TRAX has offered new mobility around the area, the Olympics and other events have shed an international light on our communities. Amongst all the change, Salt Lake City has retained many of the qualities and values that make it a livable, lively, healthy, and thriving community.

What can Salt Lake City residents learn from the experiences of these six leaders? What opportunities are available for the future, and what obstacles stand in the way? Of all their experiences in office, what are these mayors most proud of, and what do they hope their lasting legacy will be? The public will be invited to offer questions for the panel, as well.
