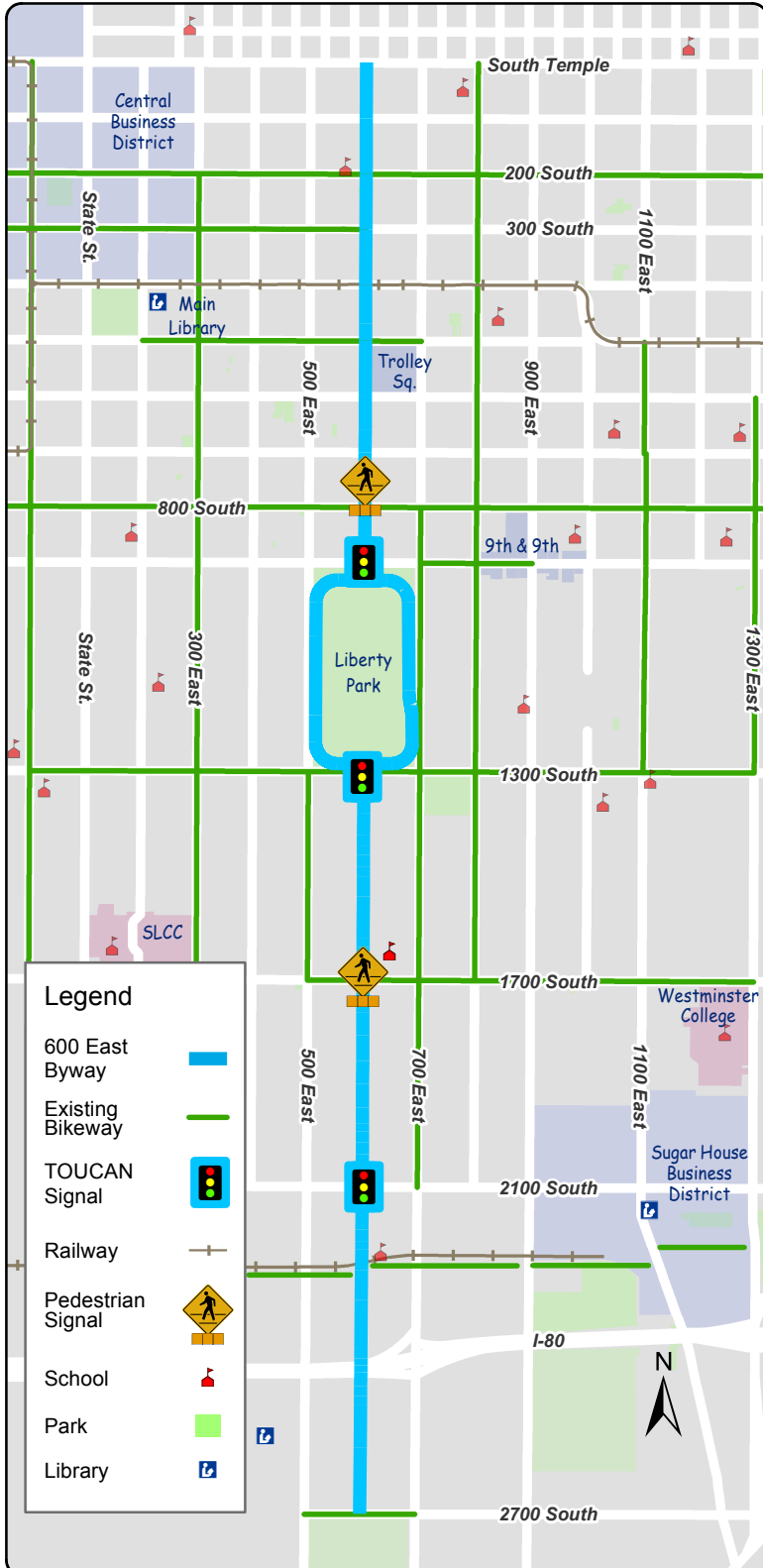


600 EAST NEIGHBORHOOD BYWAY

The 600 East Neighborhood Byway will be a low-speed, low-volume street optimized for comfortable and convenient bicycle and pedestrian travel. Also known as "bicycle boulevards," neighborhood byways are great places to walk, ride, or live, while providing key connectivity to destinations including shopping areas and parks. Construction of several traffic signals along the route is slated for summer 2015.



TOUCAN TRAFFIC SIGNALS

TOUCAN traffic signals provide safe crossings at intersections that are heavily used by pedestrians and bicyclists, such as on a neighborhood byway. Bicyclists use push buttons located on median islands to activate the signal to cross. Turning restrictions for motorized vehicles reduce conflicts with crossing pedestrians and bicyclists.

TOUCAN traffic signals will be located on 600 East at the following locations:

- 900 South
- 1300 South
- 2100 South



PEDESTRIAN SIGNALS

Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB's) provide additional visibility for pedestrians and bicyclists with a flashing signal for safer crossing at 800 South and 1700 South.



SPEED LIMITS

Reducing the speed limit to 20 mph along 600 East will provide a safer, quieter street for residents, bicyclists and pedestrians.
